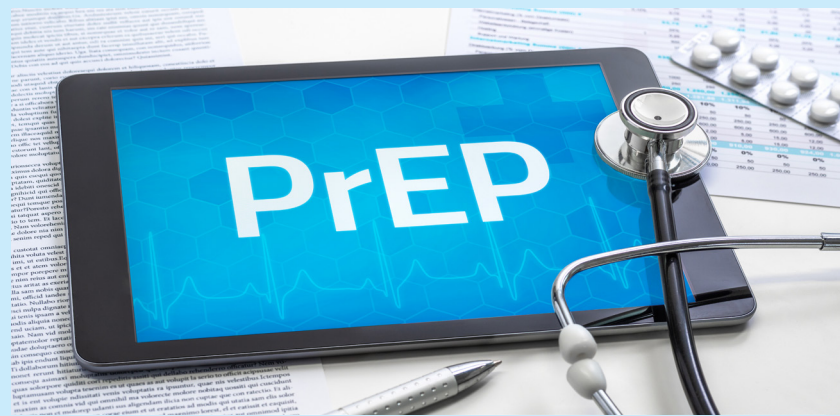


TeleHealth for PrEP
